"This year's conference centres on struggles for the Black community in Britain, waged over three decades, from the 1960s to the 1980s.

For Caribbeans in particular, these local UK struggles were at first part and parcel of a broader politics of liberation and freedom - anti-colonialist and anti-imperialist, and antiracist. The campaign slogans of the time were militant. And that militancy inflected our poetry and song. "Get up, stand up!" urged poet-musician Peter Tosh. The mood was insurrectionary. The most radical of us aspired to establishing our own non-exploitative, non-capitalist, democratic "bespoke" socialisms, back home. Cuba's was a very Caribbean revolution."
